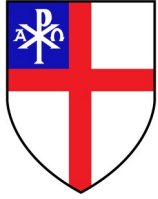

BISHOP'S EPISTLE

Change of Season, cool, fresh air this morning, reminds me of the coming season of Advent and the beginning of a new Church year. There is a joy in anticipation and blessing in seeing how God is moving in our church. It's tempting to listen to the negativity of the events of the world around us, but better to listen to and focus on what God is doing and how he is moving among his people.

Great things happening in the APA

Since our Synod in July 2019, it has been encouraging to visit parishes and see old friends and meet new members. It is spiritually uplifting to visit and see more families raising their children in the Church; to see many of our parishes becoming the core of life, the church family. And what a family we are a part of! For example, I have had the pleasure of experiencing the old and the young, the families and individuals breaking bread together at the Holy Eucharist at St. Barnabas Church, Dunwoody, Georgia. While there on October 6, I enjoyed the great African community singing and dancing and bringing others into their way of praising and thanking God for his goodness and mercy on the International Day of Thanksgiving. We are truly blessed to be a part of such a Church.

A Bright Future

Then, looking to the future, I see a number of young men moving toward ministry through postulancy, curacy and on to Ordination. There are also those who are called to a parish of their own, while others are serving a curacy in preparation of someday having their own parish. I have no doubt they will continue to bring enthusiasm and new life where ever they are or where God plans for them to be. We are blessed to have seasoned Clergy standing with our up and coming priests and deacons to help them and mentor them along the way.

The Power of Love

I recently preached a sermon on the Power of Love as opposed to the Love of Power. The world around us seems mostly focused on the Love of Power, a destructive force. I urge each one to focus on the Power of Love, which is the Love of Christ and his command to love one another. Christ-like love is the powerful, uplifting and positive force that will overcome the world. That, in fact, is what each one of us is called to embrace and to demonstrate. As we look forward to the new Church Year let us renew our commitments to be faithful and to love one another.

Praying for our new clergy

Speaking of new clergy in our ranks this year, I encourage all of you to pray for these men who are taking on the challenge of building up the Christian Community in the Anglican Way in new and unfamiliar circumstances. This has often meant moving their families, with all that entails, and re-establishing themselves in parishes with a new set of personalities. Particularly in our younger clergy families it means having children including babies among us. They are all following the godly admonition to multiply (primary evangelism). Babies and young children in the church create challenging but positive necessary adjustments in older congregations. Thank God for his leading these young well-trained men and their families to us and pray that God will bless their ministry among us.

Prayers for clergy recovering from health issues

Many of you have been praying for three of our priests who have or are recovering from critical health issues. Fr. Mark Siegel has completed five rounds of chemo-therapy with one more to go.

It is a long and difficult journey and please continue to pray for Fr. Mark and his wonderful wife Vicki.

Father Tom Burr continues to recover from his stroke. This too is a long journey and Fr. Tom is making good progress. He and his devoted wife Linda have been able to get to church on Sundays and sit in the congregation. Please pray that day by day Fr. Tom will continue in his recovery process.

Our other priest who has had serious health issues is Father David Conway. Father Dave has been battling cancer and a number of other health issues. He is described as a walking miracle by his doctors, but he is still in need of our prayers for a full recovery.

All three want me to let you know how much your prayers mean to them and their families.

Non-parochial and Retired Clergy Notice

This is a reminder to all non-parochial clergy that you are required to send your Diocesan Bishop (or Vicar General for DOW) a letter at least once a year (email is acceptable). Advent Season is preferred which is almost upon us. Please send me a letter or email during this Advent Season. This will satisfy Canon 43, Section 1 of the APA Canons which reads in part: "And every Minister not in charge of any Parish or Congregation shall also report his occasional services and if there have been none, the causes or reasons which have prevented the same." (Assistants and Curates are exempt because the Annual Parochial Report from the Rector/Vicar includes all his subordinate clergy.) I would enjoy and appreciate hearing from our clergy. Unfortunately, those non-parochial clergy who fail to contact me will ultimately be dropped from the APA roles.

Retired Clergy, although you are not required to write annually, I would enjoy hearing from you to see how you are doing.

As we approach the end of the Christian Year, I want to thank all those clergy and laity alike who have offered themselves unselfishly to the work of God's Kingdom through the APA. Some work in relative obscurity doing their faithful service to the Lord with little fruitfulness and earthly recognition. 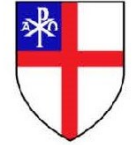
